They devasted a large swathe of southern Turkey from Hatay and Adana to Gaziantep, Kahramanmaras, Malatya and Adana as well as northern Syria. Thousands of buildings have collapsed and the subsequent gruelling and traumatising work the emergency teams now have to carry out will go on for weeks. For now, we sit glued to TV screens as rescue teams continue to pull out miracle survivors.

Many people have had their lives turned upside down in an instant, with both material and personal losses. We are sure many of you are just as saddened by this tragedy. Some of you have already reached out to us to find out how they can help. One way is through donations we are able to then forward to AHBAP a trustworthy social support organisation here in Turkey, which can then use these funds to provide help to the thousands of people affected.
